5. **Test the Connection:** Press the programmed Homelink button once. If your garage door moves, the first phase is complete. Proceed to Phase 2. If the door does not move, the rapid flashing light indicates you need to complete the second phase anyway.

Phase 2: Synchronizing the Rolling Code

Solution: Check that the safety sensor lights are aligned and not obstructed. If the green or red lights on the sensors are blinking or off, the opener will not operate properly. Clean the sensors with a soft cloth. This is unrelated to the Homelink programming itself.

I Lost My Original Marantec Remote

Cause: Without a working remote, you cannot complete the first phase of the Homelink programming.

Solution: You will need to purchase a replacement Marantec remote that is compatible with the 4500 model. You can then use this new remote to train your Homelink system. Some users also have success using a universal remote, but this can be unreliable for the rolling code synchronization. The best approach is to acquire an original Marantec remote.
