Guide Is Slow or Freezing

An older set-top box or a poor signal can cause the guide to lag. First, check that your coaxial cable connections are tight. Next, try clearing your DVR storage if it is near full — a nearly full hard drive can slow down the interface. Finally, consider upgrading to

a Cox Contour 2 or Contour 3 box, which offers faster processors and smoother guide navigation.

Missing Channels in the Guide

If you notice that certain channels you subscribe to are not appearing in the guide, you may need to rescan your channel lineup. On your remote, go to **Menu > Settings > Channel Setup > Scan for Channels**. This forces the box to reassign all available channels. Also ensure that your channel package has indeed changed — log into your Cox account to verify.
