- **Build Familiarity:** To unlock hair color options, you must get your hair styled by Harriet at least once. After that initial cut, she will trust you enough to

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move on to the next phase.

- **The Dyeing Process:** On your second visit to Shampoodle, Harriet will introduce the option to change your hair color. From this point forward, each time you visit, you can choose a new color from her growing palette.

Understanding the Hair Color System

The hair color system in **Animal Crossing City Folk** is not random. It follows a specific unlocking path. The more you visit Shampoodle and get your hair done, the more colors become available to you. This progression encourages players to experiment and regularly visit the city.

It is important to note that changing your hair color costs 3,000 Bells. This fee is the same regardless of whether you are just changing the color or changing both the style and the color. Always make sure you have enough bells in your pockets before sitting in Harriet's chair.

The Full List of Hair Colors

There are a total of eight distinct hair colors available in the game. They are unlocked in a specific order based on the number of times you have visited Shampoodle. Below is the exact progression you can expect:

1. **Default (Your natural shade):** This is the color you start with. It varies slightly depending on the face and style you choose at the very beginning of the game.
2. **Brown:** Unlocked on your second visit. A classic, neutral brown that looks natural on almost any villager.
3. **Black:** Unlocked on your third visit. A deep, rich black that offers a sleek and elegant appearance.
4. **Blonde:** Unlocked on your fourth visit. A bright, sunny blonde that stands out beautifully against the green grass.
5. **Orange:** Unlocked on your fifth visit. A vivid, warm orange that is quite bold and playful.
6. **Pink:** Unlocked on your sixth visit. A soft, pastel pink that is highly popular among players for its cute and whimsical look.
7. **Green:** Unlocked on your seventh visit. A bright, almost lime green that makes a strong statement.
8. **Blue:** Unlocked on your eighth visit. The final and most sought-after color. A cool, vibrant blue that is often considered the ultimate prize for dedicated players.

How to Choose the Perfect Hair Color

Selecting a hair color is a deeply personal decision in **Animal Crossing: City Folk**. Your choice defines how your

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character is perceived by the villagers and, more importantly, how you feel while playing. Here is a breakdown of how to choose the right shade for your town life.

Complementing Your Town's Season

Think about the current season in your game. Warmer colors like orange and pink look fantastic in the spring and summer, matching the blooming flowers and sunny skies. Cooler tones like blue and black are stunning in the winter, contrasting beautifully with the white snow. Brown and blonde are versatile year-round options.

Matching Your Outfits

Do you spend hours designing custom patterns? Your hair color should complement your wardrobe. If you love wearing bright red or yellow shirts, a neutral brown or black hair color might balance the look. If you wear a lot of pastels, pink hair is a perfect match. If you lean toward edgy, dark clothing, blue or green hair can add that extra flair.

Considering Your Eye Shape

While you cannot change your eye color in **Animal Crossing City Folk**, your eye shape and face choice can influence how a hair color looks. Some players feel that rounder, cuter faces look best with pastel or bright colors,

while more stoic expressions pair well with natural tones. This is purely subjective, but it is a fun way to approach your decision.

The Personality Factor

Are you a lazy villager at heart? A jock? A snooty fashionista? Let your character's imagined personality guide your choice. A peppy character might love pink, while a cranky character might prefer a serious black or brown. Saving Before You Dye

A common practice among experienced players is to save your game immediately before entering Shampoodle. If you sit in the chair and Harriet shows you a color that you do not like, you can reset the game without saving. When you reload, you can try again. While the color wheel is fixed, this

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trick prevents you from wasting 3,000 Bells on a shade you dislike if you accidentally hit the wrong button.

Hair Color and Hats

Remember that wearing a hat or a helmet (like the diving helmet or a king's crown) will completely cover your hair. This is an important consideration if you spend a lot of time in the city or at the island. If you love your new blue hair but are always wearing a hat, you might not get to enjoy it. Plan your accessories accordingly.

The Cost of Frequent Changes

While 3,000 Bells might not seem like much late in the game, it can be a significant expense for new players. If you are early in your journey and saving up for a bridge or a house expansion, resist the urge to change your color every week. Stick with a color you love for a longer period to save your hard-earned bells.

Can I Change My Hair Color Back?

Does Hair Color Affect Villager Interactions?

No. Villagers in **Animal Crossing: City Folk** do not react to your hair color. They never comment on it or treat you differently based on your appearance. Is There a Way to Unlock All Colors Faster?

The only way to unlock all colors is to visit Shampoodle multiple times. However, you do not need to wait a full day between visits. You can change your hair color every time you enter the city on the same day. You can theoretically unlock all eight colors in one sitting if you are willing to spend 3,000 Bells per change (totaling 21,000 Bells for all seven changes past the default).

Does My Hair Color Affect the Game Ending or

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Credits?

No. The game does not have a traditional ending, and the credits are purely cosmetic. Your hair color has no influence on story events, town evaluations, or special visitors like Gracie or Katrina.

Why Hair Customization Matters in City Folk

Hair color is more than just a cosmetic feature in **Animal Crossing: City Folk**. It is a tool for immersion and self-expression. 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Troubleshooting: Why Can't I Change My Hair Color?

- **Have you visited the city?** You must have access to the city area first.
