Essential Tips for Surviving Yamatai

To truly thrive on the cursed island, you need more than just a steady aim. 1. Master the Art of Scavenging

- **Search every container:** Cardboard boxes, supply caches,

and duffel bags often hold salvage, ammunition, and **GPS Caches** that grant bonus XP.

- **Collect animal and plant resources:** Hides, meat, and rare plants like **Lampodarie Moss** are essential for crafting upgrades for your skills and health. Always skin animals you hunt.
- **Use Survival Instinct:** Press the designated button (R3/RS) to highlight nearby interactive objects, enemies, and resources. This is your most valuable tool for finding hidden items.

2. Prioritize Weapon Upgrades

Your weapons are your only line of defense against the island’s hostile inhabitants and the Solarii Brotherhood. You can upgrade them at any campfire. Your initial resources are limited, so prioritize upgrades that offer the best return on investment.

- **Pistol:** The Climbing Axe is not a weapon, but the pistol is your first reliable firearm. Focus on **Arrow Recovery** for the bow and **Clip Capacity** for the pistol early on. The **Silencer** upgrade for the pistol is a fantastic tool for stealth sections.
- **Bow:** Upgrading the bow’s **Draw Speed** and **Stability** is critical. A faster bow allows you to line up headshots before enemies detect you.
- **Rifle and Shotgun:** Later-game weapons benefit from **Damage** and **Recoil Reduction**. The shotgun’s **Wide Choke** upgrade is devastating in close quarters.

3. Complete Tombs for Bonus Skills

Yamatai is littered with optional

challenge tombs. These are complex environmental puzzles that are completely separate from the main story. While they offer a healthy amount of salvage, their true value lies in the **unique skill** they grant upon completion. For instance, the **Chasm Shrine** tomb grants **Cartographer**, which reveals all collectible locations on the map. The **Summit Forest** tomb grants **Pathfinder**, which highlights climbable surfaces. Always seek out and complete every optional tomb you encounter. They are the key to making Lara truly formidable.

Navigating the Island: A Walkthrough of Key Chapters

The Descent into the Mountain (Early Game)

This section marks a turning point where Lara gains more confidence and better gear. You will encounter the Solarii for the first time in significant numbers.

- **Stealth is King:** Use the bow for silent takedowns. Approach enemy encampments from high ground. Use bushes for cover. The **Silent Killer** skill eliminates enemies without alerting others.
- **The Base of the Solarii:** This area is a hub. Take the time to explore the surrounding area for collectibles. There are several GPS caches hidden in the water and around the perimeter.
- **Fighting the Oni:** The supernatural enemies are tough. They are vulnerable to fire. Use fire arrows or Molotovs. Aim for their heads and keep moving.

The Final Ascent (Late Game)

The game's climax is a relentless gauntlet. You will face waves of enemies and a few boss encounters.

- **The Endurance Explosion:** A frantic escape sequence. Just focus on sprinting and jumping when prompted. Do not stop.
- **Mathias's Lair:** The final confrontation with the game's antagonist. This is a puzzle boss. You need to use the environment to damage the structure he is on.

Focus on the glowing weak points. Use your rifle for precision shots from a distance.

- **The Ascension:** The final run to the summit. It is a linear obstacle course. Keep moving, use your climbing axe to break through weakened walls, and ignore the enemies if possible—they are just there to distract you. Focus on the path ahead.

Collectibles and 100% Completion

Types of Collectibles

1. **GPS Caches:** Small, green, glowing boxes usually hidden in out-of-the-way locations. They provide a solid chunk of XP and contribute to the “Treasure Hunter” achievement/trophy.
2. **Survivor Diaries and Documents:** These are written records and audio logs that flesh out the backstory of the island and its inhabitants. They are usually found in camps, buildings, and near dead bodies.
3. **Relics:** Ancient artifacts from the Himiko era. These are often found inside optional tombs or in specific locations guarded by enemies.
4. **Challenges:** Each hub area has a set of optional challenges (e.g., “Destroy 5 Flags” or “Burn 3 Effigies”). Completing all challenges in an area grants a large XP bonus.
5. **Optional Tombs:** As mentioned,

these are complex puzzles that grant a unique skill. There are seven in total. Completing them all is essential for 100% completion.

Tips for Finding Everything

- **Unlock Cartographer:** This skill, earned from the Chasm Shrine tomb, is the single most important tool for completion. It reveals all collectible locations on your map.
- **Check Your Map Frequently:** The map is detailed. Use it to identify which areas you have not fully explored. The percentage of completion for each region is displayed.
- **Fast Travel:** Once you complete the main story, you can fast travel between base camps. This makes cleaning up missed collectibles much easier. Do not stress about finding everything on your first playthrough; you can always return.
- **Use a Guide for Tombs:** The optional tombs are the hardest part of 100% completion. If you get stuck on a puzzle, a dedicated puzzle guide is helpful. The reward is always worth the effort.

Unlocking All Skills and Upgrades

Lara’s skill tree is divided into three categories: **Survivor**, **Hunter**, and **Brawler**. Each requires experience points (XP) earned from killing enemies, completing challenges, and finding collectibles. You cannot unlock every skill in a single playthrough without significant effort, so prioritize based on your playstyle.

Skill Tree Breakdown

- **Survivor:** Focuses on survival, resource gathering, and stealth. Key skills include **Cartographer**, **Pathfinder**, **Silent Killer**, and **Keen Eye** (which highlights collectibles when using Survival Instinct from a distance).
- **Hunter:** Enhances ranged combat, primarily with the bow.

Skills like **Focused Aim** (slow-motion while aiming in mid-air) and **Bola Master** (silent takedown from a distance) are game-changers.

- **Brawler:** Improves melee combat and your ability to withstand damage. **Retaliation** (counter-attacks) and **Irongrip** (longer time on climbable ledges)
