How to Install the Kidde 0915

- **At least 10 feet away from cooking appliances** to reduce false alarms
- **At least 3 feet away from bathroom doors** to avoid steam triggering the alarm

Locations to Avoid

- **Near windows, doors, or vents** where drafts could interfere with smoke reaching the sensor
- **In very dusty, dirty, or greasy areas** such as garages or workshops
- **In areas with extreme temperatures** (below 40°F or above 100°F)
- **Directly above stoves or ovens**

Testing and Maintenance

Weekly Testing

End-of-Life Replacement

The Kidde 0915 has a service life of approximately 10 years from the date of manufacture. Look for the manufacture date on the back of the alarm. If the alarm is more than 10 years old, replace it immediately, even if it appears to be working fine. The end-of-life warning chirp is your signal to buy a new unit.

Troubleshooting Common Issues

Chirping Every 30 to 60 Seconds

Alarm Does Not Sound During Testing

Green LED Is Off

The green LED indicates that AC power is present. If it is off, check the circuit breaker and the wiring connections. If the wiring is correct but the LED remains off, the alarm may need to be replaced.
