Tips for Getting the Most Out of Your Husqvarna Viking Oscar

- **Use high-quality thread:** Cheap thread can cause tension problems and lint buildup. Stick to brands like Gütermann or Mettler for best results.

- **Experiment with different presser feet:** Even though basic feet are included, investing in a walking foot or an open-toe embroidery foot expands your possibilities for quilting and decorative stitching.
- **Practice on scrap fabric:** Before starting an important project, sew a test seam to check tension and stitch quality. The Oscar's consistency makes this a quick check.

Maintenance and Troubleshooting Common Issues

Thread Tension Problems

If your stitches are too loose or too tight, the first step is to re-thread the machine with the presser foot raised. This ensures the thread sits correctly in the tension discs. Also check that the bobbin is wound evenly and inserted in the correct direction. Lower the presser foot after threading, then test again. The Oscar's tension system is generally reliable, but adjustments may be needed for very thick or thin fabrics.

Machine Skipping Stitches

Skipped stitches are often caused by a bent or dull needle. Replace the needle with a new one, ensuring it is inserted fully into the needle clamp. for lint buildup around the hook race.

Machine Jamming or Making Noise
