How to Enter Codes in Star Wars Bounty Hunter

Depending on the platform you are playing on, the method for entering **Star Wars Bounty Hunter codes** varies slightly. The game originally launched on PlayStation 2 and Nintendo GameCube, with later re-releases on PlayStation 3, PlayStation 4, and PC via the PlayStation Network and Steam. PlayStation 2, PlayStation 3, and PlayStation 4

Nintendo GameCube

PC and Modern Ports

The PC version (available through Steam or GOG) and the PlayStation 4 re-release (part of the *Star Wars: Racer and Commando Combo* bundle) use the same code entry method as the original PS2 version. Simply pause the game and input the sequence using the keyboard arrow keys or the D-pad on a connected controller. The codes work universally across all official releases.

Complete List of Star Wars Bounty Hunter Codes

Below is the definitive table of every known **Star Wars Bounty Hunter code**. Each code is case-sensitive in terms of directional input. Use **U** for Up, **D** for Down, **L** for Left, **R** for Right, and **H** for a side-specific direction (left or right on the D-pad). Invincibility (God Mode)

Code: Up, Up, Down, Down, Left, Right, Left, Right, L1 (or L for GameCube), R1 (or R)

Effect: Jango Fett takes no damage from any enemy attacks, explosions, or falls. You can still die from certain environmental hazards (e.g., bottomless pits), but this code keeps you alive through nearly everything.

Infinite Ammo

Code: Left, Right, Left, Right, Up, Down, Up, Down, L2 (or Z for GameCube), R2 (or R)

Effect: Your blaster pistols and all secondary weapons will never run out of ammunition. Perfect for players who hate micromanaging reloads.

Infinite Jetpack Fuel

Code: Up, Down, Up, Down, Left, Right, Left, Right, L1, L1, R1 (or L, L, R for GameCube)

Effect: Jango’s jetpack fuel meter never decreases, allowing unlimited flight. Great for exploring large levels like the Oovo IV asteroid prison or the Geonosis arena.

Unlock All Weapons & Upgrades

Code: L1, R1, L1, R1, Up, Down, Left, Right, L1 (or L, R, L, R, Up, Down, Left, Right, L on GameCube)

Effect: Instantly unlocks every weapon (flamethrower, missile launcher, sniper rifle, etc.) and all upgrade modules (visor enhancements, armor plating). You can switch between them at any time.

Unlock All Levels

Code: Hold R2 (or R) then press Up, Up, Down, Down, Left, Right, Left, Right, R1 (or R). Release R2.

Effect: All story chapters become selectable from the main menu. This does not spoil story progression but lets you revisit any mission you have already cleared.

Unlock Bonus Content

Code: Up, Down, Left, Right, Up, Down, Left, Right, L1, R1, L2, R2 (or L, R, L, R, L, Z, R, R on GameCube – check your manual)

Effect: Opens the Extras menu with concept art, developer interviews, and Jango Fett’s alternate costume (the classic Mandalorian armor from the Old Republic era).

Slow Motion Mode

Code: L1, R1, L1, R1, L1, R1, Up, Down, Up, Down (or L, R, L, R, L, R, Up, Down, Up, Down)

Effect: The game speed drops to roughly half pace, making it easier to dodge attacks and aim precisely. Useful for tough boss fights.

Big Head Mode

Code: Up, Up, Down, Down, Left, Right, Left, Right, R2, L2 (or R, Z, L, R on GameCube – hold R while entering)

Effect: Jango’s head becomes comically large while his body remains normal. This is purely cosmetic and affects hitboxes only slightly.

Tips and Strategies for Using Codes

While **Star Wars Bounty Hunter codes** are fun, using them wisely enhances the experience without breaking it entirely. Here are a few recommendations:
