Best Equipment for Each Character

Dart's ultimate weapon, the **Dragon Buster**, is obtained by collecting all 50 Stardusts. For most of the game, the **Indora's Armlet** (found in a chest in the Moon That Never Sets) is an excellent accessory that boosts SP gain. Rose benefits from the **Dragon Helm** (reduces Earth damage) and the **Darkness Sword** (sold in the final town). For healers, equipping the **Magical Hat** and **Spirit Ring** increases magic defense and MP recovery.

Where to Farm Gold

If you need money, the best location is the **Mountain of Mortal Dragon** area, where you can fight enemies that drop valuable items like the **Crustaceon** (sell for 300 gold each). Another good spot is the **Forest of Scissors** after disc 1, where enemies drop **Moon Serpent Skins** worth 500 gold.
