- **Channel 816 - Music Choice: Dance / EDM:** High-energy electronic dance music with continuous mixes.
- **Channel 828 - Music Choice: Teen Beats:** Focused on younger audiences with trending pop and viral hits.

Rock and Alternative

- **Channel 807 - Music Choice: Classic Rock:** Legendary rock anthems from the 1960s through the 1990s.
- **Channel 808 - Music Choice: Rock:** Mainstream rock including active rock and modern rock tracks.
- **Channel 815 - Music Choice: Alternative:** Indie, alternative, and non-mainstream rock styles.
- **Channel 817 - Music Choice: Metal:** Heavy metal, hard rock, and subgenres like thrash and doom.

Country and Americana

- **Channel 804 - Music Choice: Country:** Contemporary country hits from Nashville stars.

- **Channel 835 - Music Choice: Smooth Jazz:** Contemporary instrumental jazz with saxophone and keyboards.
- **Channel 836 - Music Choice: Jazz:** Traditional bebop, cool jazz, and vocal jazz.
- **Channel 837 - Music Choice: Blues:** Delta, Chicago, and electric blues.
- **Channel 838 - Music Choice: Classical Masterpieces:** Orchestral works from Baroque to modern.

Holiday and Seasonal Channels

Using the Dish Interactive Music Features

Beyond simply tuning to a channel, Dish offers an **interactive music experience** through the Hopper DVR and Joey clients. When you press the "Info" button while listening to a Music Choice channel, you can see the currently playing song title, artist, and album art. Some receivers allow you to **set a sleep timer** specifically for music channels—perfect for falling

asleep without the TV staying on all night. Additionally, you can purchase songs directly from the on-screen display via the **Music Choice Buy It Now** feature, which links to purchase the track from iTunes or other digital stores.

You can also create **custom playlists** by selecting multiple music channels and having the receiver switch between them at set intervals, though this feature is limited to certain Hopper models. For most casual listeners, simply browsing the **Dish Network music channel guide** and picking a favorite channel is the best way to enjoy.

Tips to Maximize Your Dish Music Experience

Here are some practical suggestions to get the most from your music channels:

1. **Connect your TV to an external sound system.** While TV speakers work, a soundbar or surround sound system dramatically improves audio fidelity, especially for classical and jazz channels.
2. **Turn off your TV display.** Many Dish receivers allow you to press the "Mute" button twice to keep the music playing while the screen goes blank. This reduces power consumption and prevents screen burn-in on older TVs.
3. **Use the Dish Anywhere app.** You can stream music channels from your Dish subscription to your smartphone or tablet, turning your mobile device into a portable jukebox anywhere you have internet.
