Print Quality and Performance: What to Expect from the HP OfficeJet 4630

When evaluating any printer, print quality is paramount. The **HP OfficeJet 4630 e-All-in-One Series Hewlett Packard** employs HP's thermal inkjet technology, which has long been respected for producing sharp text and vibrant graphics. In practice, black text documents emerge crisp and well-defined, suitable for professional correspondence, school assignments, or invoices. At the highest resolution setting, color prints exhibit good saturation and detail, though photo enthusiasts will note that this is not a dedicated photo printer—glossy paper yields acceptable results for snapshots, but professional photographers may desire a higher-end model.

Print speeds are moderate. The manufacturer claims up to 8.5 pages per minute for black-and-white documents and up to 6.0 ppm for color. In real-world testing, these numbers hold true for draft mode, but high-quality prints naturally slow down. For standard home office use—printing contracts, reports, and occasional color presentations—the speed is entirely adequate. One area where the HP OfficeJet 4630 shines is its first-page-out time, which is relatively quick, reducing the wait for that first print.

Scanning and Copying Capabilities

The flatbed scanner on the HP OfficeJet 4630 offers a maximum optical resolution of 1200 x 1200 dpi, which is sufficient for scanning documents, receipts, and even photos with reasonable clarity. The included 25-sheet automatic document feeder simplifies multi-page scanning, whether you are digitizing a contract or copying a stack of paperwork. The copier function allows for resizing (25% to 400%), adjusting lightness and darkness, and collating multiple copies. While the scan speed is not lightning-fast, the quality is consistent, and the HP software suite provides basic editing and OCR (optical character recognition) capabilities.

Fax functionality may seem antiquated to some, but for businesses that still rely on faxed orders or legal documents, this feature is indispensable. The HP OfficeJet 4630 supports color faxing and can store up to 100 pages in memory, ensuring you do not miss important transmissions even if the paper tray runs empty.

Wireless Connectivity and Mobile Printing: Freedom Without the Wires

Setting up Wi-Fi is intuitive through the touchscreen interface, and once connected, the printer can be accessed by any device on the same network. From the app, you can scan documents directly to your phone, monitor ink levels, order replacement cartridges, and even perform basic troubleshooting. The app interface is clean and user-friendly, making it easy to manage print jobs on the go. For a printer in this price bracket, the level of mobile integration is impressive and adds significant value to the overall ownership experience.

Cost Efficiency and Ink Usage: The Real Cost of Ownership

This printer uses HP 61 (or HP 61XL) cartridges: one black and one tri-color. Standard-capacity cartridges yield approximately 190 pages for black and 165 pages for color, while high-capacity XL cartridges offer roughly 480 pages for black and 330 pages for color. The cost per page is moderate—not the cheapest on the market, but certainly not prohibitive for light to moderate use.

HP offers an optional Instant Ink subscription service, which can dramatically reduce ongoing ink costs. With Instant Ink, you pay a monthly fee based on the number of pages you print, and HP automatically sends replacement cartridges when your ink runs low. For users who print regularly, this service can lower the cost per page significantly and eliminate the inconvenience of running out of ink at a critical moment. The HP OfficeJet 4630 is compatible with Instant Ink, making it an even more economical choice for budget-conscious households.

Paper Handling and Media Support

The 80-sheet input tray is adequate for home use, though heavy-volume users may find themselves refilling frequently. The printer supports a variety of media types, including plain paper, photo paper, envelopes, labels, and cardstock. The rear manual feed slot is useful for single-sheet specialty media, such as thicker cardstock or unique paper sizes. Duplex printing (two-sided) is available but requires manual flipping of pages—a minor inconvenience that is common in printers at this price point.

Output tray capacity is modest, around 25 sheets, so for long print jobs, you may need to clear the output tray periodically to avoid paper jams. Paper jams themselves are infrequent with proper loading, but the printer's internal paper path is relatively simple, making jam clearance straightforward when it does occur.
