Flights depart from Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS) in Bali and arrive at Lombok International Airport (LOP) in Central Lombok.

Flight Duration and Schedule

Direct flights between Bali and Lombok are frequent, with multiple departures each day. Early morning and late afternoon flights tend to be the most popular. Despite the short airtime, you should factor in at least two to three hours total when you account for check-in, security, and baggage collection on the other end.

Cost of Flying

A one-way ticket typically ranges from \$40 to \$80 USD, depending on the season and how far in advance you book. Baggage fees may apply on budget carriers. For travelers wondering **how to travel from Bali to Lombok** without spending a full day in transit, flying is the clear winner.

Padang Bai is about a 90-minute drive from both Kuta and Ubud. You can take a shuttle bus, hire a driver, or ride a scooter to the harbor. On the Lombok side, Lembar is roughly 30 to 45 minutes from Mataram and about two hours from the popular Kuta Lombok area. Local bemos and taxis are available.

Option 3: Fast Boats – The Most Popular Choice Among Travelers

Cost of Fast Boats

The three Gilis – Gili Trawangan, Gili Air, and Gili Meno – lie just off the northwest coast of Lombok. Fast boats from Bali often stop at one or more of these islands before continuing to Lombok mainland. If your final destination is a Gili island, book a fast boat that lists your chosen island as a stop. Otherwise, you can take any ferry or boat to Lombok and then catch a local public boat from Bangsal Harbor to the Gilis.

Cash Is King

Some ferry terminals and smaller boat operators only accept cash. Bring Indonesian Rupiah with you, as ATMs may be limited at smaller harbors.

What to Expect When You Arrive in Lombok

Lombok is larger and less developed than Bali, so transportation options are more limited. From Lombok International Airport, you can take a taxi or pre-booked transfer to your accommodation. From Lembar Harbor or Bangsal, local taxis, ride-hailing apps (in Mataram), and public bemos are available. If you are heading to Kuta Lombok, the drive takes about 30 to 45 minutes from the airport and around two hours from Lembar.
