Essential oils are highly concentrated plant extracts, and they must be used with respect. Even though they are natural, improper use can lead to skin sensitivity or other unwanted reactions. Every reliable Young Living Essential Oils Product Guide emphasizes safety, and this one is no different.

There are three primary ways to use essential oils: aromatically, topically, and internally. Aromatic use involves diffusing oils into the air or simply inhaling them directly from the bottle. Topical use means applying oils to the skin, usually diluted with a carrier oil like coconut, jojoba, or almond oil. Internal use involves ingesting oils, but this should only be done with oils that are clearly labeled as dietary supplements and under the guidance of a healthcare professional.

Dilution Guidelines

Most single oils should be diluted before applying to the skin, especially if you have sensitive skin or are using them on children. A typical dilution ratio for adults is 2 to 3 drops of essential oil per teaspoon of carrier oil. For children, the elderly, or those with sensitive skin, use a more conservative ratio of 1 drop per teaspoon. Some oils, like Oregano, Cinnamon, and Clove, are

considered hot oils and require extra dilution because they can cause a warming or tingling sensation.

Patch Testing

Before using a new oil topically, it is wise to perform a patch test. Apply a small amount of the diluted oil to a small area of skin, such as the inside of your forearm, and wait 24 hours to see if any irritation occurs. If you experience redness, itching, or discomfort, wash the area with a mild soap and avoid using that particular oil on your skin in the future.

Diffusing Tips

When diffusing oils, follow the manufacturer's instructions for your specific diffuser. Most diffusers have a maximum fill line and recommended run times. It is generally advisable to diffuse for 30 to 60 minutes at a time, then give the diffuser and the room a break. Continuous diffusion can lead to olfactory fatigue, where you stop being able to smell the oils, and it may also overwhelm

the senses of pets or people with respiratory sensitivities.
