Auto Wheat Farm

Light up the area with torches to allow crops to grow at night.

Simple Animal Pen

Fences are your best friend. Build a rectangular pen 10x10 blocks using any fence type. Add a gate on one side. Inside, place two animals of the same species (cows, sheep, or chickens). You can breed them with wheat or seeds. For chickens,

place a single block of water in a corner to collect eggs automatically. This pen is cheap, functional, and can be expanded by adding more fence sections.

Tree Farm

Instead of wandering forests, plant your own trees. Dig a 5x5 area, place saplings in a grid pattern, and surround them with torches. Leave at least four blocks of vertical space for the trees to grow. Use any type of sapling. This simple farm ensures a steady supply of wood without destroying the landscape. You can even build a small shed nearby to store axes and saplings.

Decorative Simple Builds

Cozy Campfire Area

Add a wooden door and a stone path outside. This workshop is both functional and immersive. You can even install a grindstone and a few barrels to complete the look.
