Puzzle 4: The Household Item

Answer: Glass

This shadow shows a tall, cylindrical shape with a slight widening at the top and a thin stem near the bottom. Answer: Leaf

Rotate the Image Mentally

Shadows can be presented at angles that are unfamiliar, making a recognizable object look strange. Try to mentally rotate the silhouette or view it from a different perspective. What looks like an odd blob might be a familiar object seen from above or below.
