The hardest part is often finding rare species like the Cougar or the Badger. Use bait and a rifle for clean kills. Do not forget to skin every animal you kill to confirm the species.

The Most Difficult Trophies: A Deep Dive

Every trophy hunter knows that a few achievements will separate the casual players from the dedicated completionists. In *Red Dead Redemption*, these are the trophies that will test your patience and skill.

The Legend of the West

This is the big one. "**The Legend of the West**" is the Platinum trophy itself. To earn it, you must achieve 100% completion in the single-player game. This is a massive undertaking that includes completing all story missions, all stranger

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missions, all bounties, all challenges (Shooting, Hunting, Survival, Treasure, and Master Hunter), and acquiring all outfits. The outfits are particularly time-consuming because they require you to complete specific challenges. For example, the "Savvy Merchant" outfit requires you to complete the Survival challenges. Gold Rush

The "**Gold Rush**" trophy requires you to earn a Gold Medal on a set number of story missions. This is not just about completing the mission; you must also meet specific criteria, such as accuracy percentage, time limits, and headshot counts. This trophy is often cited as one of the hardest in the game. My advice is to replay missions after you have upgraded your weapons and health. Use Dead Eye liberally and aim for headshots to boost your accuracy score. This trophy can be frustrating, but it is achievable with practice.

Manifest Destiny

In the **Undead Nightmare** expansion, the "**Manifest Destiny**" trophy requires you to survive a specific wave-based challenge known as "The Graveyard." This is a pure test of combat skill. You will be swarmed by zombies, and you must use every tool at your disposal – from shotguns to holy water – to survive. Positioning is everything. Find a corner or a bottleneck and hold your ground. Do not forget to use your horse for quick escapes, but be aware that it can be killed.

Multiplayer Trophies: The Online Grind

While the online servers are still functional on older consoles, the player base is understandably smaller. Some trophies are easier to boost with a friend, while others can be earned organically.

Posse Up!

Undead Nightmare: A Separate Challenge

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Zombie Genocidist

Chupacabra Hunt

One of the more unique trophies in the expansion is finding and killing the mythical Chupacabra. This creature only spawns at night in specific locations. It is fast and tough. Use the Rolling Block Rifle for a clean kill. If you do not find it on your first try, ride away and return later. It will eventually appear.

Saving the Survivors

Throughout the **Undead Nightmare** map, you will find survivors trapped in

houses or camps. Rescuing them is a key part of the expansion. The trophy "**Savior**" requires you to rescue a certain number of these survivors. This is tied to the story progression, so keep an eye out for them. Use the torch to break down barricades and kill zombies near the doors.
