Starting Procedure

2. Press the primer bulb firmly 5 to 6 times until fuel is visible flowing into the bulb. This purges air from the fuel line and ensures the carburetor is primed.
3. Set the choke lever to the CLOSED or FULL CHOKE position when starting a cold engine. If the engine is already warm, leave the choke open.
4. Gently pull the starter cord slowly until you feel resistance. This is the point where the Zip Start spring engages. Continue pulling slowly through the entire cord stroke, allowing the spring to compress.
5. Release the cord and let it retract fully. Do not let the cord snap back on its own, as this can damage the mechanism. Guide it back gently.
6. Repeat the slow pull and release process. The engine should start within 2 to 3 pulls if the system is working correctly. If it does not start, check your choke and primer settings.

After Starting

Once the engine fires, allow it to warm up for 15 to 30 seconds at idle before engaging the cutting head. Move the choke lever to the OPEN position if it was closed. Squeeze the throttle trigger to increase engine speed and begin trimming. When you are finished, press the stop switch or allow the engine to idle for a minute before turning it off to cool down.

Maintenance Tips from the Manual

Regular maintenance is crucial for extending the life of your weedeater. The spark plug should be inspected annually or after 50 hours of use. Remove it using a spark plug socket and check the electrode gap. The manual specifies a gap of 0.025 inches (0.635 mm). Clean the electrode with a wire brush if it is lightly fouled, or replace the plug with a compatible model such as an NGK BPMR7A or equivalent. A worn or dirty spark plug is a common cause of hard starting.

Trimmer Line Replacement

The cutting head uses monofilament line that wears down over time. When the line becomes too short, you will need to reload it. Refer to your manual for the correct line diameter, which is typically 0.080 to 0.095 inches for this model. To replace the line, remove the spool cover, take out the empty spool, and wind fresh line in the direction indicated by arrows on the spool. Feed the ends through the eyelets and reassemble. Properly winding the line prevents tangling and ensures consistent feeding.

Fuel System Cleaning

If you store the weedeater for more than 30 days, it is wise to drain the fuel tank and run the engine until it stalls. This prevents fuel residue from clogging the carburetor. Once a year, you can add a fuel stabilizer to the tank if you use the trimmer regularly. If the engine has been sitting for an extended period, clean the carburetor using a carburetor cleaner spray, following the instructions in your manual.

Troubleshooting Common Issues

Most Homelite trimmers have idle and high-speed adjustment screws, but these should only be tweaked if you have experience. A simpler fix is to clean the carburetor and replace the fuel filter. Additionally, inspect the exhaust port for carbon buildup, as this can restrict flow and reduce power.

Safety Precautions

Safety is paramount when operating any string trimmer. The manual stresses wearing long trousers, sturdy shoes, safety glasses, and hearing protection. Keep bystanders and pets at least 50 feet away. Always inspect the area for hidden objects like rocks, wire, or glass that could become projectiles. Never operate the weedeater on a ladder or unstable surface. If the trimmer line breaks, release the throttle immediately and allow the head to stop spinning before inspecting it.
