Step 3: Connect the Drain Hose

The drain hose attaches to the back of the washer. Secure it using the provided clamp if your model has one. Route the hose to your standpipe or laundry tub. Use the U-bend clip to hold the end of the hose in place. Ensure the hose is not kinked or pinched. The end of the hose should be inserted no more than 6 inches into the standpipe to prevent siphoning. If you need to extend the hose, use a genuine LG extension kit and never exceed the maximum length specified in your manual.

Step 4: Level the Washer

An unbalanced washer can be noisy and may even walk across the floor during the spin cycle. Place the bubble level on top of the washer, first front-to-back, then side-to-side. Adjust the four leveling legs by turning them clockwise or counterclockwise. You can usually turn them by hand, but a pliers or wrench can help if they are stiff. Once the bubble is centered, tighten the lock nuts on each leg by pushing them upward against the washer base. Check the level again after tightening, as this can sometimes shift the adjustment.

Step 5: Make the Electrical Connection

LG washers require a dedicated 120-volt, 60 Hz, 15-amp circuit. Plug the power cord into a grounded three-prong outlet that is within reach of the cord without stretching. Never use an extension cord or a power strip. If your outlet is two-prong, you must have it upgraded by a licensed electrician. Ensure the outlet is not behind the washer where it is hard to access; the plug should be easy to disconnect in an emergency.

Step 6: Perform a Final Check

Before pushing the washer into its final position, verify all connections. Confirm that shipping bolts are removed, hoses are tight and not kinked, the drain hose is secure, and the leveling legs are locked. Gently push the washer into place, taking care not to pinch the hoses or cord. Leave at least one inch of clearance behind the machine for airflow.
