- **Economy and Pro Models:** These may have additional terminals for heat pumps, multi-stage systems, or humidifiers. Their manuals are more detailed and include advanced wiring diagrams.

Always locate the model number on the back of the thermostat or on the original packaging. Step-by-Step Installation Process

Once you have prepared and gathered the necessary information, you can proceed with the physical installation. The following steps reflect the typical guidance found in a White Rodgers manual. Note that you should still refer to your specific manual for any model-unique details.

1. Remove the Old Thermostat

With the power off, carefully remove the cover of your old thermostat. Most snap off or have small screws. Unscrew the base plate from the wall, but leave the wires attached for now. Gently pull the wires through the base plate and let the old thermostat hang by the wires. Take your reference photo and label each wire with a small sticker (the manual often suggests using the supplied wire labels). Unscrew each wire from its terminal and straighten the ends.

2. Prepare the Wall

If you are mounting the new White Rodgers thermostat in the same location, you may need to patch or drill new holes for the wall anchors. Use a level to ensure the base plate is perfectly horizontal – an unlevel thermostat can look unprofessional and may affect the internal sensor (though most modern digital thermostats are not sensitive to tilt). The **White Rodgers Thermostat Installation Manual** typically includes a template for drilling holes. Mark the positions, drill if necessary, and insert the provided anchors.

3. Mount the New Base Plate

Feed the labeled wires through the center opening of the new base plate. Secure the plate to the wall using the screws provided. Do not overtighten, as plastic can crack. Verify that the plate is level before moving on.

4. Connect the Wires

This is the most critical part. Refer to the wiring diagram in your **White Rodgers Thermostat Installation Manual**. Each wire should be connected to the terminal with the same letter. Common terminals include:

- **R or Rc:** Power (24V AC). Some models have separate Rc and Rh for cooling and heating – a jumper may be required if your system uses a single transformer.
- **W:** Heating control.
- **Y:** Cooling control (compressor).
- **G:** Fan control.
- **C:** Common wire (provides continuous power, often needed for Wi-Fi models).
- **O/B:** Changeover valve for heat pumps (O for cool active, B for heat active – check your manual).

Strip about ¼ inch of insulation from each wire end, insert it into the terminal hole, and tighten the screw. Gently tug on each wire to confirm it is secure. Do not let bare wires touch each other outside the terminals.

5. Attach the Thermostat Body

Once all wires are connected, carefully push any excess wire back into the wall opening (avoid pinching wires). Snap the thermostat body onto the base plate – it should click into place. Do not force it; if it doesn't align, check that the pins are not bent.

6. Restore Power and Test

Turn the power back on at the breaker or switch. The thermostat screen should light up (for digital models) or show a display. Follow the on-screen or manual instructions to set the system type (e.g., conventional, heat pump, gas/electric) and verify that each function works: turn on heat, cool, and fan separately. Wiring for Special Systems: Heat Pumps, Multi-Stage, and Wi-Fi

Many homes have heat pump systems or multi-stage equipment that require extra attention during installation. Wi-Fi Thermostats and the C-Wire

Most White Rodgers Wi-Fi thermostats (Blue Series) require a common wire (C-wire) to provide continuous power for the wireless module. If your existing system does not have a C-wire, the manual may offer alternatives such as using a power extender kit (PEK) or connecting to the furnace's transformer directly. Ignoring this requirement can lead to intermittent power loss, resetting the Wi-Fi connection, or draining batteries quickly. Carefully read the section on "Power Options" in your **White Rodgers Thermostat Installation Manual**.

Programming and Initial Setup

After installation, you must program the thermostat to match your system and personal schedule. The manual will walk you through the menu options. Typical steps include:

1. **Set System Type:** Choose from conventional, heat pump, gas/oil/electric, etc.

Be sure to read the manual's programming section thoroughly – many users regret rushing this step and later find their thermostat heats the house when they are not home.

Troubleshooting Common Installation Issues
