If you want to control your DVD player with the SRU 3003WM17, try these codes:

Code List for VCRs and Other Devices

For VCRs, satellite receivers, or cable boxes, you can use the following codes:

- **Samsung VCR** – 3001, 3008, 3015, 3023, 3034, 3045, 3056, 3068

Please note that these lists are not exhaustive. If you do not find your brand or the code does not work, refer to the automatic programming method described below.

How to Program Your Philips SRU 3003WM17 Remote

There are two primary methods to program the **Philips Universal Remote SRU 3003WM17**: direct code entry and automatic code search. Both methods are straightforward, but you may need to try multiple codes if the first one does not work.

Method 1: Direct Code Entry

This is the quickest method if you have the correct code from the list above or from your manual.

1. Turn on the device you want to control (TV, DVD, VCR, etc.) manually using its power button.
2. On the Philips remote, press and hold the **SETUP** button until the red light on the remote turns on and stays lit. Then release the SETUP button.
3. Press the device button you want to program (e.g., **TV**, **DVD**, or **VCR**). The red light will blink once and then stay on.
4. Using the number keypad, enter the 4-digit code from the list. The red light will turn off after the correct code is entered.
5. Point the remote at your device and press the **POWER** button. If the device turns off, the programming was successful. If it does not, repeat the steps with a different code.

Once the remote is programmed, all the buttons (volume, channel, input, etc.) should work with your device.

Method 2: Automatic Code Search

If you do not have the code or the direct entry method fails, you can use the automatic search feature. This method scans through all the codes stored in the remote until it finds one that works with your device.

1. Turn on your device manually.
2. On the Philips remote, press and hold the **SETUP** button until the red light turns on and stays lit. Release the SETUP button.
3. Press the device button you want to program (e.g., **TV**). The red light will blink once and then stay on.
4. Press the **POWER** button repeatedly (once per second) while pointing the remote at your device. The remote will send a power-off signal for each code. When the device turns off, stop pressing the POWER button immediately.
5. Press the **SETUP** button to lock in the code. The red light will turn off.

This method may take several minutes, but it is highly effective when you cannot find the correct code
