The Recent Renewel of Interest

Key and P.A. Works have collaborated on new works like "Kaginado," a chibi crossover of Key's worlds, which included Angel Beats characters. Moreover, the mobile game "Heaven Burns Red," also written by Maeda, shares thematic DNA with Angel Beats. These projects keep the franchise in the public eye. In 2023, the official Angel Beats Twitter account posted a cryptic image of Otonashi's ID card, sparking a wildfire of rumors. While it turned out to be a merchandise promotion, it proved that the brand is still active. Many fans interpreted this as a hint that an **Angel Beats Season 2 release date** might be in the far-off planning stages.
