While exact prices change seasonally, the following venues have historically offered wedding packages within or very close to the \$2,000 mark. Always call ahead to confirm current rates.

1. **Sunrise Garden at Lake Elkhorn, Columbia** – This community park features a charming gazebo overlooking the lake. The rental fee for a two-hour ceremony slot is around \$500, and you can add a small reception area in the adjacent pavilion for an extra \$250. Total cost: approximately \$750. Maximum capacity: 50 guests.
2. **Frederick County Historical Society Gardens, Frederick** – The garden behind the historical society building is a hidden gem. For non-peak days (Tuesdays-Thursdays), the fee is \$1,200 for four hours. It includes use of a small indoor space for the bridal party. Capacity: 60 guests.

Their wedding package for a micro-wedding (up to 30 guests) is \$1,500 for a four-hour rental, including setup and basic chairs. It is a perfect spot for nature-loving couples.
4. **Havre de Grace Maritime Museum, Havre de Grace** – The museum’s lawn overlooks the Susquehanna River. Ceremonies are \$1,800 for a three-hour slot on a Friday or Sunday. The fee includes a covered porch area and use of the museum restrooms. Capacity: 80 guests.
5. **St. Mary’s County Fairgrounds, Leonardtown** – If you are open to a retro-fairground vibe, the rental of the main pavilion is only \$600 for a full day. You must bring in all vendors, but the

space is large enough for dancing and dining. It is especially affordable for a casual, DIY affair.

Tips for Booking a Budget-Friendly Wedding Venue in Maryland

Finding **Maryland wedding venues under 2000** takes a bit of creativity and flexibility. Use the following strategies to stretch your dollar further.

- **Choose an off-peak day and season.** Saturdays from May through October are the most expensive. Opt for a Friday, Sunday, or a weekday wedding.
